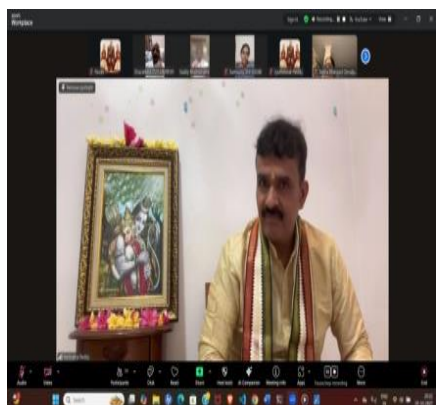


International Webinar

Department of Physics, S.P.W. Purushotham, Senior Educational officer, RSC, Tirupati along with his team demonstrated experiments using liquid nitrogen. He delivered a lecture explaining the properties of materials at extremely low temperatures. He also explained the production and handling of liquid nitrogen. A live demonstration using liquid nitrogen was conducted during which students observed and participated in various experiments, including rapid freezing of flowers and rubber materials and the effects of extreme cooling. The demonstration aroused the curiosity among the students and helped them understand fascinating concepts of science through practical display. Overall, the program was highly informative and beneficial in enhancing the practical knowledge of Physics students.
