BRIEF HISTORY

Sri Padmavathi Women's College at Tirupati was established by the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams in 1952 to serve the educational needs of women students of Tirupati and its surrounding areas. It started functioning from 2nd July 1952 as a second grade college (Offering Intermediate courses only) under affiliation to Madras University. With the formation of Andhra State the College was affiliated to Andhra University in 1954. Consequently to the founding of Sri Venkateswara University, the college was brought under affiliation to S.V. University and upgraded to a Degree College in 1956. It continued to be a composite college offering PUC/Intermediate and Degree courses until it was bifurcated into S.P.W. Degree College and S.P.W. Junior College in 1995. The Junior College subsequently moved to its own campus.

The College was first named "Sri Venkateswara College for Women". As there were already two colleges named after the Lord of the Seven Hills in Tirupati and to avoid confusion, the college was named after the Lord's consort at Tiruchanoor, Sri Padmavathi Ammavaru. After the bifurcation of the composite college, S.P.W. Degree College and S.P.W. Junior College have become two independent institutions.

The college which had eight teachers and 35 students at the time of its inauguration on 11-08-52 has over these years emerged as a premier women's institution in Andhra Pradesh with about 42 faculty members on regular basis and 48 members on contract basis offering instruction in as many as twenty five subjects of study to more than 2500 students. It offers 3 year Degree Program in CBCS pattern leading to B.A., B.Com., B.Sc., & B.Sc. Home Science along with 3 P.G. Programs of S.V. University.

The Golden Jubilee celebrations began on the founder's day on 11th August 2001 and continued with a chain of activities. The final celebrations were inaugurated by Sri P. Chalapathi Rao Chairman TTD Trust Board, on 9th August 2002. The Hon'ble Chief Minister Sri Nara Chandrababu Naidu garu as the Chief Guest of the valedictory on 14th September 2002.

With the kind encouragement of the TTD management we have also started post graduate courses in Organic Chemistry and Commerce from 2007-2008, English from 2008-2009, Physics from 2009-2010 and Bio-Technology from 2010-2011, affiliated to S.V. University with the permission of APSCHE. The TTD Management has sanctioned P.G. Block of 3 floors with classrooms, seminar hall and laboratories.

LOCATION

The college was located in S.V. Arts College, Tirupati in the first year of its functioning (1952-53). It moved into its buildings in September 1953. Sri Venkateswara University was brought into existence in 1954, all the buildings belonging to S.V. Arts College and S.P.W. College had to be handed over to the S.V. University according to an Act of the T.T.D's. However the college was allowed to function in the same buildings till 1961 when it moved into its present spacious building which is located opposite to S.V. University, Tirupati

CAMPUS

S.P.W.D. & PG College has a developed campus with many imposing buildings, well maintained lawns and gardens. It is surrounded by a ring of hills, facing the sacred hill Seshachala. The college is a little away from the high way but in close proximity to

Co-curricular activities are encouraged to ensure comprehensive development of the students and many extracurricular activities are conducted to ensure their social involvement.

Students Code of Conduct:

- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behavior inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the college.
- 2. A six day working schedule from Monday to Saturday is followed. Classes are scheduled from 9.30 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- 3. The college will begin with a prayer song in the college assembly ground. The students shall stand in attention till the prayer ends followed by National Anthem. Those who are standing outside the classroom are also expected to follow this.
- 4. All the students are expected to be present in the class well within time and late coming will result in loss of attendance for the corresponding hour.
- Students shall rise from their seats when the teacher enters the class room and shall be greeted with "Om Namo Venkatesaya". Silence shall be observed during class hours.
- 6. No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the concerned Teacher.
- 7. In the event of Student seminars/project presentations etc. it is compulsory that all the students of the concerned class be present for the entire session.
- 8. Students can leave the compus during class hours only after getting a gate pass from the Principal, HOD, or the mentor and after making entry in the Gate Register maintained by the gate keeper.
- All students shall leave the classes immediately after 5 p.m. No students shall wander or gather in veranda, corridor, and staircase etc. Do not spend much time in canteen etc.

- All leave applications (Regular & Medical) shall be submitted in time, for sanction by HOD and concerned Teachers. Application for medical leave shall be accompanied by valid medical certificates.
- 11. Students shall come to the college in approved uniforms. Besides, those who are in laboratories shall wear their respective lab-coat.
- 12. All the students shall wear their identity cards, well displayed. Identity badge is a public document and any Teaching Staff and non-Teaching staff shall have the right to use it.
- 13. Students are expected to maintain silence in the academic buildings to maintain the decorum and, any deviant behaviour such as hooting, loitering etc. will be treated as an instance of indiscipline.
- 14. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, common computing facilities and to involve in professional body activities or any program authorized by the college beyond class hours. However under normal circumstances students shall retreat to their hostels or residences by 6.00 p.m.
- 15. Keep the campus neat and clean. Do not put any waste anywhere in the campus except in the waste baskets kept.
- 16. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the college and destroy the academic ambiance.
- 17. Carefully handle the furniture, equipments, fixtures and appliances of the college and lab. Careless handling/misuse of the above could result personal injuries or damage to property.
- 18. Follow safety precautions near moving machines and electrical installations. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair with fine.

- 19. Students are expected to make use of academic, co-curricular and extracurricular facilities available to the optimum levels. This will certainly make them physically fit, academically competent, mentally alert and socially sensitive.
- 20. During internal examinations of 2 hours period, students are not allowed to leave the hall within one hour from the beginning of the exam, and students have to occupy the seat 5 minutes before the commencement of the examinations.
- 21. Political activity in any form is not permitted in the College campus. Un-authorized meetings, propaganda work, processions or fund collections are forbidden within the College, hostels, and outside the college.
- 22. Harassing Juniors, ill treatment to other fellow students or any such form of ragging is objectionable and liable to be treated as criminal offence by the law enforcing agencies as per the directives of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- 23. Any violation of the above rules will invite penality in the form of warming, fine, bringing of parents or any course of corrective measure as found suitable by any staff member or higher authority of the College.
- 24. Mobile Phone Policy: The purpose of this policy is to establish clear cut guidelines regarding the usage of mobile phones inside the campus. This policy is applicable to all those who enter the campus. Realizing the importance of communication and the possible impact of mobile phone usage inside the campus, the following guidelines are arrived at.
 - * Students are not permitted to use mobile phones within the campus.
 - * Students who are staying in college hostels should not bring the mobile phones to the colleges.
 - * All the staff members are empowered to confiscate mobile phones found with students violating the above rules. Mobile phones will be returned to the students only after the completion of their course.

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COLLEGE FACILITIES

Buildings:

In its beautiful and well developed campus S.P.W.Degree & P.G. College has imposing permanent structures which bear eloquent testimony to the desire and endeavour of the Tirumala Tirupati Devasthanams to make this college a show piece among its educational institutions. The main building of the college accommodates all the class rooms, staff rooms, laboratories, administrative offices and Rajeswari Moorthy Seminar Hall. The college has also a number of extension units such as N.S.S., N.C.C. and Scouts. The beautiful Home Management Cottage is a part of the Dept. of Home Science and the students of this Dept. live in it for a short time when they learn the art and science of house-keeping and domestic budgeting.

The concrete structure in this college gain their charm from the tall-grown green trees and well-laid and maintained gardens and lawns in this campus. Man in co-ordination with nature has worked together to make this campus a beautiful and serene place for uninterrupted and purposeful academic pursuit.

The TTD constructed residential accommodation close to the college to the staff including the Principal, the Warden, and the Dy. Warden of the college.

Hostel:

One of the main attractions of S.P.W.Degree & P.G. College is the hostel facility for its students who come from far of places. The T.T.D. Management is liberal in granting funds for expanding and improving this facility. A new block Harini with capacity of 150 Nos., is started during 2014-2015. Six blocks of residence – Sri Devi, Bhudevi, Srinivasa, Gandhi, Vakula and Harini accommodate about 2,400 students. Most of the rooms in these halls have attached bath. Each one has a reading room, a library and a lounge for the visitors. T.T.D. is magnanimous to provide meals at free of cost. Besides, the hostel has, over these many years, earned the appreciation and confidence of the parents who often express that their children are safe when they are in the hostel.

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The hostel is managed by an advisory committee consisting of the Joint Executive Officer, TTD, the Devasthanams Education Officer, the Principal who is the Chief Warden, Warden, Deputy Wardens, and student representatives. Sub-committees comprising students mainly assist in the management of the hostel. All these committees and sub-committees have one aim and one desire and that is to make each resident happy and healthy.

Sri Padmavathi Ammavari Temple is situated in the hostel premises and all festivals are celebrated.

<u>Library</u>:

The Library of the College with its large collection of books in various branches of study and a good number of magazines, periodicals, journals and news-papers offers facilities for study and recreational reading. Students are encouraged to make the utmost use of the library. The library has the open rack system and is housed in a spacious building. Library automation done completely INFLIBNET-N-LIST services provided to access number of e-Books and e-Journals to the staff and students. A statue of Pandit Nehru in front of the library serves to inspire the students to spend long hours in it.

Other amenities:

An extension counter of the Union Bank, a cafeteria and a branch of the Mamatha Mahila Co-Operative Bazaar function in the college to serve the staff and students all the year round.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

The college believes that good education includes activities not only within the class rooms and laboratories, but also outside these, and provides for a variety of extra-curricular and co-curricular activities. Some of these are mentioned here.

Games and Sports:

The Dept. of Physical Education organises the games and sports activities for the students. They are encouraged to utilise fully the facilities for games and sports and participate in

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inter-collegiate and inter-university events. It is heartening to note that the students of this college often secure the Intercollegiate Championship as well as awards. The department has a well established gym for the benefit of the staff and students.

Students Council:

The College student council serves to inculcate among students a sense of belonging to the institution and develop in them social responsibility. All the students are members of the council. The activities of the council are organised by student office bearers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Joint Secretary), installed at the beginning of every academic year. The various associations of the college function under the auspices of the council. The Principal of the college is the Ex-officio President of the council and also of the various Associations. Staff members serve as faculty advisor. Council inauguration is a function that the students and staff look forward to eagerly and hold with great enthusiasm.

Academic Associations:

Each Department of study has its own student association for furthering of knowledge and understanding outside the class room. These associations hold meetings seminars, guest Lectures etc..

Audio-Visual Education:

All the students are members of this Association. The Principal nominates one of the members of the faculty to look after the functions of it. Devotional films, speeches, documentaries and films related to the academic subjects are screened on the T.V. in the Audio-Visual room which has internet connection. Devotional and Patriotic songs are also played at the functions held in the college.

Fine Arts Association:

Students who are interested in music, dance, drama and painting become members of this association. They present cultural shows annually on the College Day and the Hostel Day and

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participate in Inter-University Youth Festivals conducted at State level, and secure prizes and awards for thier performance.

National Service Scheme:

The college has a strong N.S.S. unit. A large number of students become members of this unit voluntarily and render valuable social service. They visit the nearby villages to spread literacy and instruct rural women folk about basic household hygiene and primary health care. They are in the forefront of Shramadan activities and clean and green programmes. They also participate in social service activities related to flood and earthquake relief whenever and whereever they occur. Two staff members co-ordinate N.S.S. programmes.

National Cadet Corps:

N.C.C. established a N.C.C. unit for the benefit of the students of the college. All those students who are desirous of getting military training enrol themselves in the unit. During the period of training the cadets attend Summer Training and Social Service Camps. At the end of the training the cadets are awarded certificates. They appear for the B & C certificate examinations. As in games and sports the students of this college secure prizes and awards for their outstanding performance in N.C.C. Camps and often participate in the Republic Day and Independance Day Parades in New Delhi

Environmental Club:

The Environmental Club was started in December 1995 with the objective of creating and spreading awareness about environment among students, staff and local peopel. Membership is open to all the students and staff. Activities of the club are managed by a committee consisting of President (Principal Ex-Officio) Vice-President and Secretary nominated by the Principal. Student council Chair-Person is Ex-Officio Vice-President, all Head of Departments are advisors to the club.

ECO Club Activities: (a) Campus cleaning (b) Plantation (c) Counselling (d) Cultural activities to encourage talented

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students. Every 3rd Saturday the above activities are to be conducted.

IQAC:

The National assessment and Accreditation Council advocated the establishment of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) by all the accredited institutions as a post accreditation quality sustenance activity. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of institutions. The members of IQAC meet to review, discuss and plan for quality sustenance and enhancement in academics as well as administration. The IQAC makes a concerted effort to review and sustain the quality standards of the College in every aspect of functioning such as Curricular, Teaching Learning and Evaluation, Infrastructure. Student Support, Research, Consultancy and Extension, Governance, Leadership and Innovative Practices, guided by the Quality Advisory Committee (QAC) consists of coordinator and other members. S.P.W. Degree & PG College was accredited by NAAC in 2006. In the second cycle college achieved A+ Grade with highest CGPA of 3.43 and stood as top score among all UG & Womens Colleges of Andhra Pradesh.

Diet Counselling Centre:

There is a Diet Counselling Centre attached to Home Science Department. It is supervised by the staff of the department specialized in nutrition to create awareness regarding the effective dietary management of chronic degenerative diseases such as Diabetes Mellitus, Cardiovascular diseases, Renal problems and so on.

The centre also offers Dietary Guidelines to pregnant, lactating women, pre-school children, adolescent girls, weight control groups and different sections of population suffering from malnutrition.

A.P. Productivity Council:

A computer centre was established in the college by Andhra Pradesh Productivity Council (APPC) to provide the services of internet facility to the students. The centre is one of the pioneer

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organization in the State of Andhra Pradesh in running the computer courses and providing training by experienced faculty. The council is also conducting the Diploma (6 months), P.G. Diploma (1 year) and software certificate courses for the students.

Student Counselling Centre:

It is being run and supervised by faculty of Psychology department. Students take Counselling for various reasons and problems like emotional distrubances, depression, memory loss, loss of concentration, learning disabilities, stress, personality problems and conflicts etc.,

Students Grievance Redressal Cell:

There is a Grievance Redressal Cell to solve the students complaints.

Placement Cell & Career Guidance:

College has placement cell which guides the students for placement in IT Companies like Tech Mahendra, i-gate, Wipro and JGate Global solutions etc. Some of our students were selected for clerical posts at nationalised banks conducted by IBPS.

It provides coaching for ICET, MAT, PGCET, communication skills, personality development etc. Some of the students secured admissions in top Business Schools and in Post Graduate Courses.

Autonomous:

The SPW Degree & PG College was conferred with autonomous status for a period of 10 years i.e. from the academic year 2023 - 2024 to 2032 - 2033. Autonomous status will be implemented from the academic year 2024 - 2025.

College Magazine:

The college magazine is published annually by the students It contains articles in English, Telugu, Hindi, Sanskrit and Tamil, which includes items of pictorial and other interest, and sums up a year's work in creative endeavour and collegiate activity.

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Extension Activities:

Educational Tours to supplement class room studies are organised. The Dept. of Botany, Zoology, Sociology, Social Work, Physics, Psychology, Population Studies and Home Science are particularly active in arranging field trips.

Srivari Seva Programme:

With a view to instill a sense of dedication, devotion and selfless service in the students, the TTD Management has introduced a compulsory "Srivari Seva" Programme.

Accordingly every week fifty students from the institution led by a group of lecturers will attend to the needs of the pilgrims at Tirumala, like guiding them, controlling the queue lines, serving in the nitya annadanam programme, sannidhi seva and also furnishing information to them regarding all the religious activities. Lecturers are also drafted for Srivariseva or Vaikuntam 'Q' Complex.

MAJOR FUNCTIONS

Founder's Day:

Every year August 11th is celebrated as founder's day. Student's Council organises pooja kainkaryam for Goddess Saraswathi in the college premises, in a grand manner. Staff & students actively participate in pooja event Govindanamalu, Vishnu sahasranamam and Annamacharya Keerthanas are sung, Senior faculty share their memories and finally prasadam is distributed to one and all.

Student Council (Inauguration Day):

Students council is formally inaugurated on a Specific day by renowned people from Tirupati. Oath taking to the student council officer bearers is major activity of the day. Election to the council is by the nomination of students with highest marks in SVU Exam. Programme ends with cultural activities.

Freshers Day:

On the same day in the evening Freshers' Day is conducted for first year students by inviting the famous presonolities of the

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town. Hostel office bearers are nominated on the basis of merit and oath taking is observed. The event ends with cultural activities.

College Day:

College Day is celebrated every year, a little before the college closes for the academic year. It is an annual celebration in which the year's activities culminate and are reported to the students, their parents and general public. Prizes and merit certificates are awarded at this function to the students for their academic distinction. The students present a cultural show to celebrate the occasion.

Hostel Day:

Hostel Day is celebrated by the students every year to mark the completion of a year's stay in the hostel. Students in the hostel invite their own guest and pay host to them. A report of the hostel activities during the year will be presented by the Warden to the cheif guest. Prizes are given to the hostel residents for distinguishing themselves in games, sports and other competitions held exclusively for them. Awards are bestowed on those residents who have conducted themselves in an exemplary manner in the hostel. The celebration is rounded off with cultural show and entertainment.

Faculty Forum:

Faculty Forum is one of the great traditions of S.P.W.D. & P.G. College. It was created by Faculty, hungry for rich conversation across academic disciplines. The Faculty are always welcome and often join the conversations. It is a delightful mixture of encouragement and challenge provided by these diverse audience. This Forum is felicitating the retired staff in a grand way. The problems and grievances of the Faculty members are discussed and tried to solve.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Attendance:

The college works from 9-00 a.m. to 5-00 p.m. with a Lunch Break between 1-00 p.m. to 2-00 p.m. It mostly follows the

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academic calendar given by S.V. University. The working day is divided into 6 periods each of one hour duration. Attendance is marked for every period. Attendance is linked to Govt. sponsored scholarships. It is mandatory for every student to have 75% of attendance to draw the scholarship.

Candidates who have fallen shortage of 75% attendance and on whose behalf the condonation applications are not forwarded are not eligible for promotion to the next higher Class. Such candidates should repeat the course in the same class in the next academic year and shall take the examinations after putting in the required 75% of attendance.

All students must be present for atleast 75 percent of the total class hours in the year. If this requirement is not fulfilled, provided that they were present for atleast 50 percent of the class hours, condonation fee as specified below has to be paid to be allowed to appear at the University Examinations.

First 5 days of shortage : Rs.130/- per day Beyond 5 days and below 1 month : Rs.130/- per day 30 days and above : Rs. 180/- per day

Note: This Provision is applicable only to those students who have put in atleast 50 percent of attendance

In case of continued absence the names of such students will be struck off from the rolls.

A student who is not able to attend college should send a leave letter addressed to the Principal before 10 a.m. of the day for which leave of absence is sought. Application for leave of absence from the students residing in the Hostel must be counter signed by the Deputy Warden.

LIBRARY RULES FOR STUDENTS

Borrowing Regulations:

- 1. The Library is only for S.P.W. Degree & PG College Students and staff.
- 2. Students must present <u>a valid college Identity Card</u> in order to borrow Library Materials.

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- 3. Borrowing privilages are not transferable and must be excercised personally.
- 4. Borrowing previlages do not extend to periodicals.
- 5. All materials checked out is subject to recall immediately if needed in the Library.
- 6. Borrowers are responsible for material checked out until it is returned to the Library.

Loan Period:

- 7. Books are checked out for 15 days loan and may be renewed if they have not been reserved by other reader (This applies to staff tickets also).
- 8. All Books must be brought to circulation desk for renewals.

Over Due Books and Fines:

- 9. 1 rupee per day is charged for each Book over due (For staff tickets also)
- 10. Library Records must be cleared by 15-03-2021.

Lost and damaged Books:

11. If the borrower is unable to replace the Books or damaged or spoiled she should pay the money as per the rules set by the Library.

General:

- 1. The College Library follows open access system and works on all working days from 9-00 a.m. to 5-00 p.m.
- Books and other materials taken from stocks should not be reshelfed by the students, but they should be left on the tables in the reading room. Please remember that a book misplaced is book lost.
- 3. While entering the Library, Students should leave their personal belongings such as Bags, Umbrellas, Personal Books and Parcels etc. in the racks kept for the purpose.
- 4. Readers should maintain strict silence and decorum in the Library and should not disturb other user in any manner.
- 5. Eatables are not allowed inside the Library.
- 6. Reader should not deface, mark, cut, multilate or damage

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- the books. If anybody violates this rules, she is liable to be expelled from the college.
- 7. Readers shall leave their seats before the closing time.
- 8. All payments including fines should be paid in the College Office.

CBCS (Choice Based Credit System):

SVU introduced CBCS for students (semester wise) from the academic year 2015-2016.

Discipline:

- 1. Mobile Phones are not allowed. If found, phones are taken away (not to be returned). In addition they should pay Rs.5,000/ as fine and one month suspension from college.
- 2. Students shall conduct themselves in such a manner as to uphold the standard of the college and its traditions. And they shall aim at developing a healthy spirit of comradeship among themselves.
- 3. It is expected that every student will be courteous to the members of the teaching staff. She should greet them whether they deal with her directly or not, step aside for them to pass and stand up when approached.
- 4. The student shall rise when the Lecturer enters the class room and remain standing till she desires them to sit or till the Lecturer takes her seat.
- 5. The Student who has no class to attend at any particular hour in the day may sit in the library or in any class room that is unoccupied at the hour but on no account disturb the classes at work, she shall observe strict silence during working hours.
- 6. The students are not expected to take part in any political agitation directed against the authority of the Government. They should not attend or organise any meeting in the college or collect money for any purpose without the permission of the Principal.
- 7. Ragging is an offence and strictly prohibited as per GOMS No.67, Higher Education (EC) Department dt. 31-08-2002 in all educational institutions. Any violation in this regard is highly punishable.

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Examinations:

The college conducts two internal examinations during each semister. Attendance is compulsory and serious notice will be taken on absence. As these are meant to prepare the students for examinations and most importantly these marks are added for final result of the University examinations.

Certificates:

The College issues on written requisition from the students Transfer Certificates and Conduct Certificates at the time of their leaving the college. Students should state their full address, year of leaving the institution, the class and the group in which they studied. The students should give the office a week's time for preparing their certificates. Under no circumstances will the certificates be issued on the same day they apply for them.

Hostel Fee:

All hostel students have to pay an amount of Rs.3,015/-.at the time of admission.

Fee Regulations:

The academic year is divided into two semesters i.e., the first semester, from the reopening of the college till it closes for the first semester end holidays. The second semester re-opens after First semester end holidays and works till the last working day of the academic year.

The fees for the academic year must be paid based on academic schedule given in the calendar. If the fee is not paid with fine even by the end of 30 working days from the beginning of the year then the name of student will be struck off from the rolls. Absence from college with or without leave will not exempt the students from this rule.

A student shall not be admitted after the beginning of the year unless she has paid all the fees prescribed and her name will be removed on the rolls.

Migration Certificate fee and Pass Certificate fee are payable to the S.V.University by the students from the other University areas.

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SCHOLARSHIP AND FINANCIAL AID

The College takes great care and interest in helping students to secure all available financial aid and scholarships. During the last academic year a large number of students received financial aid of some kind or other.

Scholarships:

Government scholarship for students belonging to the Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes: This covers the tuition fee, special fee and examination fee (and all types of fees other than the refundable ones) if the applicant is eligible. Eligibility criteria for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Parent's / Guardian's Income should not exceed Rs.2,00,000/- per annum.

N.B. The following certificates should be produced.

- a. Caste certificate from Mandal Revenue Officer concerned only.
- b. Income certificate from MRO or Salary Certificate from the salary drawing officer concerned in the case of salaried parents / guardians.
- 2. Government scholarship for Listed Backward Classes: Students belonging to Listed Backward Classes are eligible for the award of scholarship on the same lines as the Scheduled Castes and scheduled Tribes. The parent's / guardian's annual income should not exceed Rs.1,00,000/- per annum. The following certificates should be produced.
 - a. Caste certificate from Mandal Revenue Officer concerned only.
 - b. Income certificate from MRO or salary certificate from the salary drawing officer concerned in the case of salaried parents / guardians.

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3. National Merit Scholarships for the top ranking students: (amount to be sanctioned as per Government rates and rules)

Fee Concessions:

- 1. Full Fee concession: All students belonging to S.C., S.T and O.B.C. and Harijan, Christians are entitled to full fee concession provided their parent's / Guardian's annual income is less than Rs. 2 lakhs.
 - a) Caste Certificate issued by the Mandal Revenue Officer concerned only.
 - b) Income Certificate issued by the Mandal Revenue Officer or salary certificate issed by the salary drawing officer in the case of salaried parents/guardians.

Note: Only on production of caste and income certificates the students belonging to S.C., S.T. and O.B.C. will be exempted from payment of fees at the time of admission. No representation for exemption from payment of fees will be entertained on the plea that the certificates would be produced at a later date. Hence, the students are advised to keep ready the required caste and income certificates in original when they attend the interview for admission. Children of TTD Employees are eligible for full fee concession.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION MALPRACTICES NORMS FOR PUNISHMENT

The following is the revised list of norms for punishment for implementation with effect from April - May 1981 Examinations.

NATURE OF VIOLATION OF RULES

PENALTY

- 1. Repeated mutual consultations 1. The particular paper will be inspite of warnings.
- 2. Writing names, register Numbers, $\frac{2}{3}$ initials or marks of identification in answer books or Additional Books.
- 3. Possession of relevant material.
- 4. Actual use of books or other ⁴. material for copying.
- 5. Inserting unauthorized Answer / Additional Book
- 6. Impersonation
- 7. Tampering with Register Number on main answer books
- 8. Assaulting invigilator, Chief Cancellation of the examination superintendent on the and 6. debarring for the next College Campus

- The paper will not be valued The result of that examination will be cancelled. Candidates will not be permitted to take next TWO Examinations
- Cancellation and debarring for the next SIX examinations.
- If the candidates quilty of Impersonation is students of any college in this University area they will not be permitted to continue their studies for a period of Three Years. If the persons who have imper-sonated are not students, legal action will be initiated against them.
- Cancellation of the examination and debarring for the next FOUR Examinations Cancellation of the examination and debarring for the next FOUR Examinations
- 9. If the students assaults the Asst. Superintendent or the Chief Superintendent outside the college campus. The chief superintendent should immediately report the police for immediate action. The University should also request the police authorities to complete the investigation quickly. If the investigation reveals that the candidate is quilty of assault he should be suitably punished.
- 10. Any cases not covered above are left to the discretion of the Malpractice Committee.
